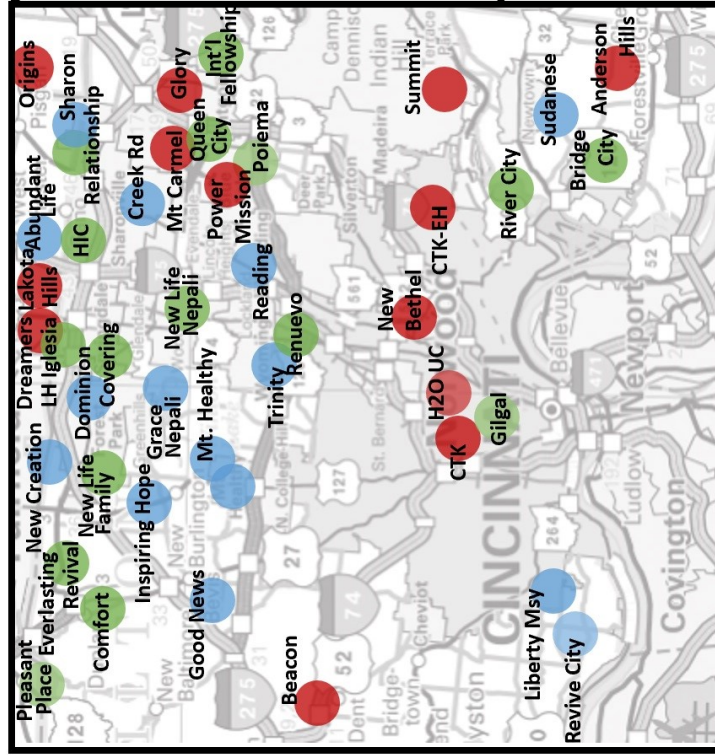

CABA Churches minister in nine counties: Adams, Brown, Butler, Clermont, Clinton, Fayette, Hamilton, Highland, and Warren.

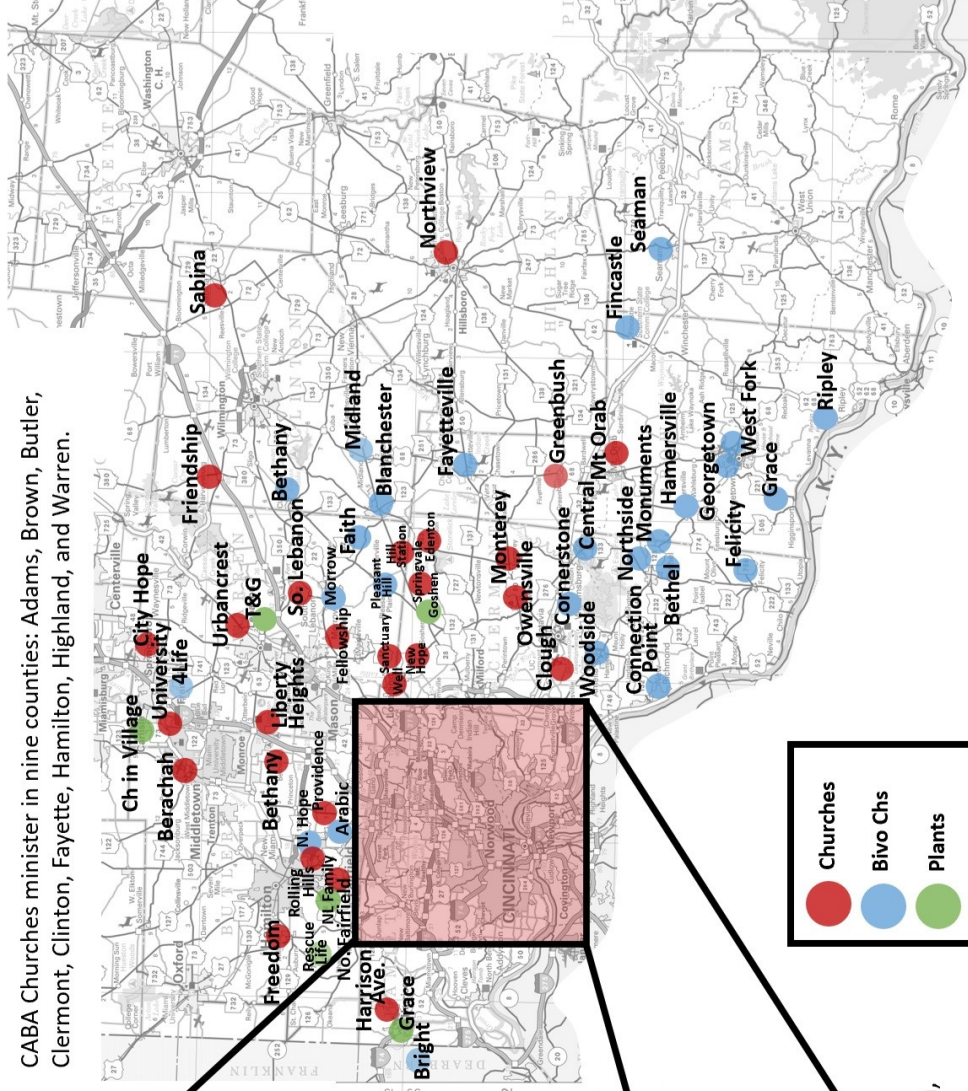

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

CINCINNATI AREA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE 1: NAME

The name of this Association shall be the Cincinnati Area Baptist Association.

ARTICLE 2: PURPOSE AND MISSION

This association is the successor by merger of two Associations known as the Southern Hills Baptist Association and the Baptist Association of Greater Cincinnati. The Purpose and Mission of this Association is to enhance the greater ministry impact and effectiveness of the member churches as they seek to advance and fulfill the Great Commission, in voluntary cooperation with the State Convention of Baptists in Ohio and the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE 3: MEMBERSHIP

This Association shall consist of those churches that voluntarily unite with the Association and who are in accord with the Baptist Faith and Message. Each Member church in good standing shall be entitled to send 3 messengers to the Association's Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings. Such messengers shall be entitled to vote upon all matters of Association business to be considered at these Meetings.

ARTICLE 4: OFFICERS

The officers of this Association shall be: Moderator; Vice-Moderator; Treasurer; Clerk; and Trustee. All Officers shall take office upon the close of the Annual Meeting at which they are elected and shall hold office until their successors are elected. Except for Clerk and Treasurer, no officer shall hold office for more than 2 successive terms. All officers shall hold office for one-year terms.

ARTICLE 5: ADMINISTRATION

The Association may create offices, committees, and agencies for the administration of the Association, as may be deemed useful and necessary to accomplish the mission of the Association.

ARTICLE 6: AMENDMENTS

The Constitution may be amended by an affirmative vote of three-fourths of the messengers present and voting at the Association's Annual Meeting. The proposed amendment must be submitted to the Association at the prior Annual Meeting.

BY-LAWS
OF THE
CINCINNATI AREA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I: AUTHORITY

- Section A. **Authority:** The Association shall be wholly advisory, and shall never assume an ecclesiastical authority over the churches. The Association shall not send any council, committee, or other group into any church, except upon direct written request of that church.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

- Section A. **Messengers:** Each member church in good standing shall be authorized to elect 3 messengers. Each church plant is encouraged to constitute and apply for membership in the Association as early as possible.

- Section B. **Affiliation:** Any church desiring to be received into the fellowship of the Association shall forward a written request (letter or email) to the Association office at least 90 days prior to either the Annual or the Semi-Annual Meeting. This request should include the church's statement of faith, constitution, and declaration of their purpose to cooperate with the Association. The Administrative Leadership Team (ALT) will be responsible to examine the credentials of the petitioning church. Recommendations from the ALT shall be made to the Association at either the Annual or Semi-Annual Meetings. Upon the approval of a three-fourths (75%) majority vote of the messengers present to receive the church, the moderator shall declare the church received and its messengers seated.

A church may choose to withdraw from the fellowship of the Association with written notification.

- Section C. **Discipline:** The Association reserves the right to withdraw fellowship by a three-fourths (75%) majority vote at an Annual or Semi-Annual Meeting from any church it deems:

1. To have departed from the teaching of the New Testament (as summarized in the Baptist Faith and Message) in doctrine or conduct as previously stated in the article on membership of the constitution this Association; or
2. To have failed to correspond with the Association for two (2) consecutive years. Upon invitation from the church, this church shall first be visited by a group assigned by the Administrative Leadership Team to determine the cause and seek resolution; or
3. To have refused to support financially the program of the Association.

ARTICLE III: ADMINISTRATION

- Section A. **Administrative Leadership Team (ALT):** The ALT shall be responsible for the administrative functions of the Association, including but not limited to finance/ budgeting, personnel, nominating, credentialing of churches, and programming for the Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings.
1. **Membership:** The ALT shall consist of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer, Clerk, the Trustee and four (4) At Large members elected at the Annual Meeting. The four At Large members shall serve a two-year term and be staggered to prevent the entire team from changing over at the same time. It may also include additional non-voting members, as appropriate to the task.
 2. **Nominations for ALT:** The ALT is responsible for presenting nominations for the ALT at the Annual Meeting. However, any church may propose additional nominations. If there are more nominations than positions to be filled, then a ballot vote shall be taken.
 3. **Responsibilities:** The ALT shall act for and on behalf of the Association between the Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings, but shall refrain from making major decisions that can be deferred until one of those meetings. The ALT may recommend that the moderator call a Special Session of the Association, if needed.
- Section B. **Staff:** The Association may employ such staff, as it deems necessary. The ALT shall be responsible for employing or making recommendations of persons, compensation packages, and job descriptions for all employees, with the exception of the Director of Missional Leadership.
1. **Selection of the Director of Missional Leadership:** The Association will appoint a special search committee, which will be responsible for recommending a candidate for approval. The Association must approve the recommended candidate by a three-fourths (75%) majority vote.
 2. **Selection of Other Career Missionaries:** The ALT will be responsible for recommending a candidate for approval by the Association in session. The Association must approve the recommended candidate by a three-fourths (75%) majority vote.
 3. **Termination of Missionaries:** The ALT will be responsible for recommending the termination of the Director of Missional Leadership and other career missionaries to the Association. The Association must approve such recommendations to terminate with a majority (>50%) vote.

Section C. **Financial Contributions:**

The Association, in exercise of its religious purposes and strategies, will establish designated accounts to be controlled by the Administrative Leadership Team (ALT). The ALT may consider recommendations from anyone, but in no event is the committee bound in any way to honor the recommendations. Donors will not be permitted to recover a contribution on the grounds that the ALT failed to honor the donor's recommendation.

If the Association votes at any time in the future to close a particular designated account, all the money in that fund will go to the general budget of the Association. If funds are not used within a year of the last donations for the purpose intended, the ALT has the authority to make decisions on the future of the account.

ARTICLE IV: MEETINGS

Section A. **Meetings:** This Association shall meet two (2) times per year at the Annual and Semi-Annual Meetings.

Section B. **Special Session:** The moderator, upon the advice and consent of the Administrative Leadership Team, may call a special session. Notification must be made in writing to the churches at least two (2) weeks prior to the session. It must include the reason for the meeting and the matter(s) to be considered.

Section C. **Parliamentary Procedure:** The latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the procedure of all sessions.

Administrative Leadership Team Report

Recommendations from ALT

CABA MEMBERSHIP:

- **MOTION #1:** The ALT unanimously recommends that we welcome Comfort Missionary Baptist Church (pastor: Emery Nzamuye) and Grace Church (pastor: Austin Mathis) into CABA.
- **Credentialing:** we have begun the second round of our 5-Year checkups with member churches. A subgroup of the ALT (e.g., Ben Wilson, Fran Trascritti, and Mark Wilson) has been identified as a Credentialing Committee to work with Mark Snowden on any needed follow-up from these checkups.

PERSONNEL UPDATES:

- **Block Party Maintenance:** we have hired Rick Adams as our part-time maintenance tech. Rick is a retired machinist and is a deacon at Bethel Baptist Church.
- **Biblical Counseling Resources for our Pastors:** we want to thank Cliff Myers for providing needed biblical counseling to our pastors for the last few years. Cliff is not able to continue, so we have identified Mark Lefleur and Priscilla Peters as our resources moving forward.

FINANCIAL:

- **2024-2025 (10/24-12/24) Results:** we ended the first quarter \$23,543.51 in the red (e.g., Total Income was less than Total Expenditures). Several actions have been implemented to reduce expenses.
 - Church contributions from 10/24 thru 2/25 were \$89,768.91, which is a decrease of 8.75% from the \$98,372.48 contributed in the same period last year.
- **2025 Dunn-Hopkins Offering:** we appreciate the offerings that we have received to date. We have been able to support mission trips for two pastors to date: Fran Trascritti (Costa Rica), Bink Garbutt (New Zealand).
- **Trustees:** two key projects.
 - **CABA Office:** the roof of the office was replaced last fall.
 - **Anchor:** we have approved \$13,000 to rebuild the showers at the Anchor.

CHURCH UPDATES:

- Harrison Ave. Baptist: Ron Renner is serving as interim pastor thru Easter.
- FBC Anderson Hills: Mark Baugh has announced plans to retire after 23 years of service. The church will be establishing a pastor search committee soon.
- Christ the King: has moved to Northern Kentucky.
- Covering Church: looking for a new location.

MINUTES OF 13th ANNUAL MEETING OF CABA

SEPT. 16, 2024

The Cincinnati Area Baptist Association met for their 13th Annual Meeting on Monday, Sept. 16, 2024, at New Hope Baptist Church in Loveland, OH.

The messengers were led in praise and worship by the Cornerstone Worship Team. Darrell Hammons, Pastor of New Hope, welcomed everyone and led in an opening prayer. Doug Saunders, Moderator of CABA, then called the meeting to order.

Allen Suit, CABA Clerk, moved to seat the messengers. We had 24 messengers from 17 churches, 19 guests from 10 churches, and 2 representatives from the SCBO in attendance.

During his CABA report, Mark Snowden identified by name over 30 leaders in the work of CABA. We then had an opportunity to gather in small groups and pray for them. Churches were also given Week of Prayer packets and flashlights to help promote the Week of Prayer theme of "Community Engagement." Mark's written report was on p. 10 in the Book of Reports (BoR).

Ray Taw shared about the international work going on in CABA:

- ESL partners
- IFCC international – soccer connections with internationals
- Local vision trips (ex. recent Nepali one)
- Vancouver vision trip – desire for collaboration between Vancouver and CABA churches
- His written report was on p. 12 of the BoR.

Travis Smalley was not able to attend the meeting in person, but shared a encouraging video from Kevin Ezell on the work going on in NAMB. His written report was on p. 12 of the BoR.

Reagan Wagoner shared exciting news about Ohio from the SCBO: baptisms were up 96% in two years; giving is ahead of budget meaning more to missions; 28 new churches were started or affiliated with SCBO. His written report was on p. 13 of the BoR.

Allen Suit, chairperson of the ALT, presented 3 recommendations from the ALT. Their written report was on pp. 14-15 in the BoR, and the proposed budget was on pp. 20-21 in the BoR.

MOTION #1: The ALT recommends that you approve the following churches to join CABA:

- CFDC Sudanese (Christian Family Development Center Sudanese Mission): Yousif Gwalima (pastor). Transferring from OVBA.
- River City: Matt Neace (pastor). Church plant out of Revive City.

This motion was unanimously approved by the messengers.

This motion was unanimously approved by the messengers.

MOTION #3: The ALT recommends your approval of the attached budget for the 10/24-9/25 Fiscal Year. Key items for context:

- This assumes church contributions of \$223,796, which is essentially flat to the expected receipts from the current fiscal year.
- This includes a “drawdown” of \$39,954 from our checking account to fund the total budget.
- This includes a 3% salary increase for personnel.
- This includes \$12,000 to replace the roof on the CABA office.

This motion was unanimously approved by the messengers.

Allen Suit expressed our strong appreciation for Greg Burch and his 10 years of service as our Treasurer. Mark Snowden will be presenting a plaque to Greg at his home church in the near future.

Bill Hounshell raised a concern about the lack of contributions to CABA from most of the church plants, asking what is shared and expected from our credentialing process. Allen Suit indicated that in every credentialing review, we ask what their plan to meet the expectation of financial giving is when they join CABA. Mark Snowden has also shared that with Travis Smalley and Oliver Hawkins, so they can encourage giving from their end.

Doug Saunders introduced the keynote speaker for the evening – Fran Trascritti, pastor of Beacon Church. Fran gave a challenging call to action from 1 Peter 4:7-11. The title of his message was “The End is Near – What We Must Do.”

Doug Saunders concluded the meeting with a motion to adjourn.

The meeting was followed by a dessert fellowship.

Seeing the good news of Jesus Christ spread throughout North America is our primary goal. We want to help churches plant churches and see a church in every community in the Greater Cincinnati area. If your church would like to discuss how we can partner with you and the Cincinnati Area Baptist Association contact one of us. We are ready to help you plant or replant a church.

If you have an interest in starting a church planting residency, we can help with that. Some exciting opportunities developing are the possibility of planting a Vietnamese church and Chinese Church. Please pray that this will be God's will and that the potential planters will be able to move to Cincinnati to plant churches.

We also are praying for a way to reach the many refugees in our area that come from Uzbekistan, Mauritania, and other places around the world.

Below is a list of five things that happened recently and some upcoming opportunities:

- In 2024 there were 10 new churches planted in the Greater Cincinnati area.
 - 6 of the 10 are ethnic churches.
 - We are currently working with 42 church planters in the Greater Cincinnati area that are under the five-year mark of being endorsed to plant a church. Our prayer is to see over 200 new churches started by 2033 in the Greater Cincinnati area over a ten-year period.
 - 2025 is shaping up to be a good year with 3 church planters already approved to plant a church and 9 others waiting to go to the assessment retreats in April and September.
 - We are hosting two **Sending Labs** this year. One is on April 24th at Gracepoint Middletown and the other on October 23rd at Clough Pike Baptist Church. The Sending Lab is a one-day workshop that will help you develop a vision and plan for leading your church to send. It's a collaborative experience that will connect you with other pastors on the same journey, while guiding you to identify your next steps for finding, developing, and sending church planters. International Mission Board Report

We praise God for how he is working through the IMB in reaching the nations of the world! Here are the global statistics for 2024:

- 1,609,869 Partial or Full gospel sharing to individuals.
- 795,482 Individuals responding to a full gospel sharing.
- 144,969 Decisions to follow Jesus.
- 68,628 Baptisms

The IMB's desire is to impact lostness globally but it also prioritizes reaching the least reached peoples across the world through PROJECT 3000. This project focuses on reaching the over 3000 unengaged and unreached people groups (UUPG) in the world. They are some of the most difficult peoples to reach living in jungles, across deserts, and in the mountains. The IMB needs persons willing to serve as "Missionary Explorers" to go to these UUPG's, learn their culture, assist full time missionaries develop evangelistic strategies, and become prayer warriors. Currently there are:

- 3072 UUPG's
- 83 Explored UUPG's
- 57 Engaged UUPG's
- 19 Missionary Explorers sent out

The IMB would like to have 300 Missionary Explorers sent out.

These are wonderful results from the work of our missionaries but does not paint a complete picture of how lostness is being engaged by the IMB. Our missionaries are very active in human needs projects, discipleship, leadership training, partnership formation, and the preparing and mobilizing of national believers to fulfill the Great Commission.

At least 73% of our CABA churches filled out their ACP report before the deadline, and we are excited to see what all that shows as we compile the results along with all of the other associations to see what all God is doing across our state! One CABA church that reported their ACP was way up in baptisms this year, and we look forward to sharing more in the coming months with you about what all God has been doing there.

Also, mark your calendars for September 25 for the return of our Southwest Ohio Leaders Conference which will be held at Grace Point Hunter. This year, the focus will be on evangelism, and we encourage you to bring leaders with you that want to grow in their understanding of how to share the Gospel well in our SW Ohio context. Every area of ministry will be represented with breakouts focused on reaching the lost through the ministries of our churches. I also want you to mark your calendars to come and hear Richard Blackaby at Mt. Carmel Baptist this fall October 11-12 as he discusses "Fruitfulness in Ministry". Grateful for Cliff Myers as he helps us organize this for the fall!



Director's report – Mark Snowden

It was exciting to join with Mark Wilson, moderator, to interview pastors of two church plants seeking to be received as full-standing churches. Emery Nzamuye and Austin Mathis provided insights to missions zeal and biblical foundations.

Two churches were the main focus of consultation in the last part of 2024. At one church, I provided a prayer conference, a town hall meeting, moderated a business meeting, and met with leadership teams. In the other church, I have met twice with a Pastor Search Team. I recruited pulpit supply and interims in both churches. A third church is just beginning the process after a sister church helped them for nearly a year, living out our process for “networking solutions.”

A special meeting that was called The Elite 8 was conducted twice among CABA's fastest growing churches. Each senior pastor shared their vision, strategy, and insights. This was a helpful fellowship and provided hours of excellent networking.

During October, and as a result of input during the Annual Meeting, I contacted churches that had made \$0 Church Contributions to CABA in the previous year. Of the 15, three are now giving, five say they are unable at this time, and seven chose not to respond to emails, texts, or phone calls.

The Japanese Fellowship was removed from CABA's contacts since it is not a plant nor a church. Members belong to other churches. Appreciation goes to Ray Taw who connected with their leaders.

For the second year, CABA sent out a 5-yr. Checkup in October; this time to 16 CABA churches chosen at random. To date, nine churches have responded to the survey. The ALT elected a new Credentialing Committee that will provide a review to this and the previous year's responses from the churches.

A pastor fellowship was conducted in January with Dr. Ken Whitten, who is NAMB's pastor to the pastor. We met at Fellowship Baptist in Maineville prior to the Men's Summit at Urbancrest Baptist in Lebanon.

Financial oversight: At the end of 2023-24 budget year, we finished \$13,692.62 in the red against budget having received \$266,485.16. Of that, \$221,092.02 was Church Contributions. At the end of the year, we had \$106,861.06 in the bank. CABA had an additional \$159,929.02 in reserves through the Ohio Baptist Foundation. This totaled \$266,790.08 in assets not counting the trailers, CABA Office, and Clifton properties.

The 1st Quarter finances (Oct.-Dec.) were sent out using the new budget report. At present, there is \$340.11 in unpaid credit cards. CABA currently has \$246,625.90 in checking, savings, and reserves as of February 18, 2025.

The ALT has approved spending \$13,000 to repair the Anchor's upstairs bathroom including a larger shower, new walls, a new fan, and tear-out. This request came from the Anchor residents as an urgent need. The Clifton property is managed by H2O Church.

Biblical counseling was used by one couple.

One church plant has requested a church logo.

At the end of March, CABA's one-year subscription to *The Baptist Paper* for each pastor will lapse. Pastors are encouraged to subscribe on their own to the paper or email version.

Appreciation is expressed to Dr. Steve Hopkins for providing Bill Elliff's book, *Simply Prayer*, for each of our pastors. We congratulate him on his pending retirement on April 7th, 50 years after his ordination as pastor. What a legacy!

Finally, we lost a faithful worker in the CABA family. Mrs. Nora (Ron) Sergeant, member and church secretary, FBC Anderson Hills, died in January. She had been one of the association's two weekly check signers for 12+ years.

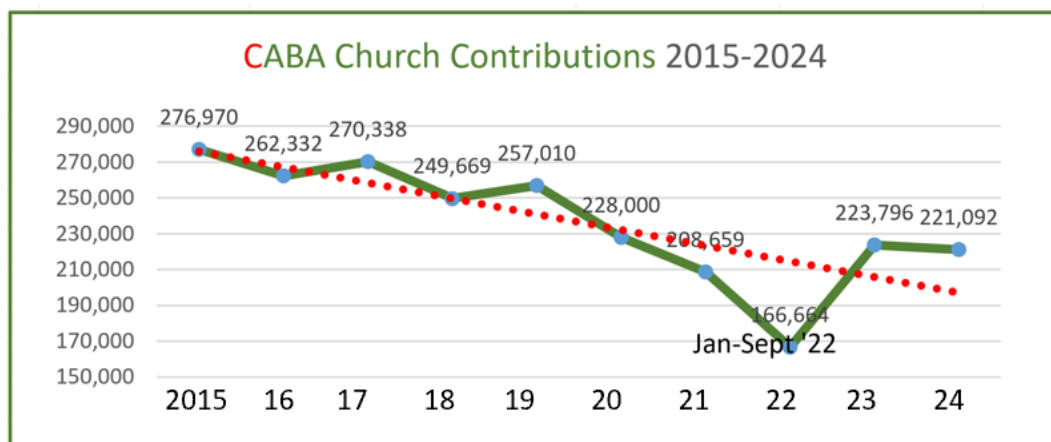
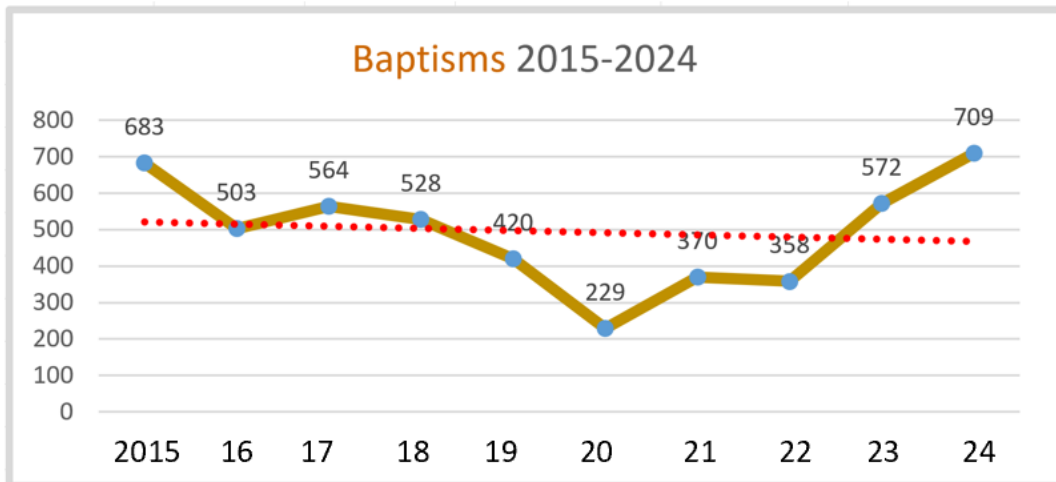
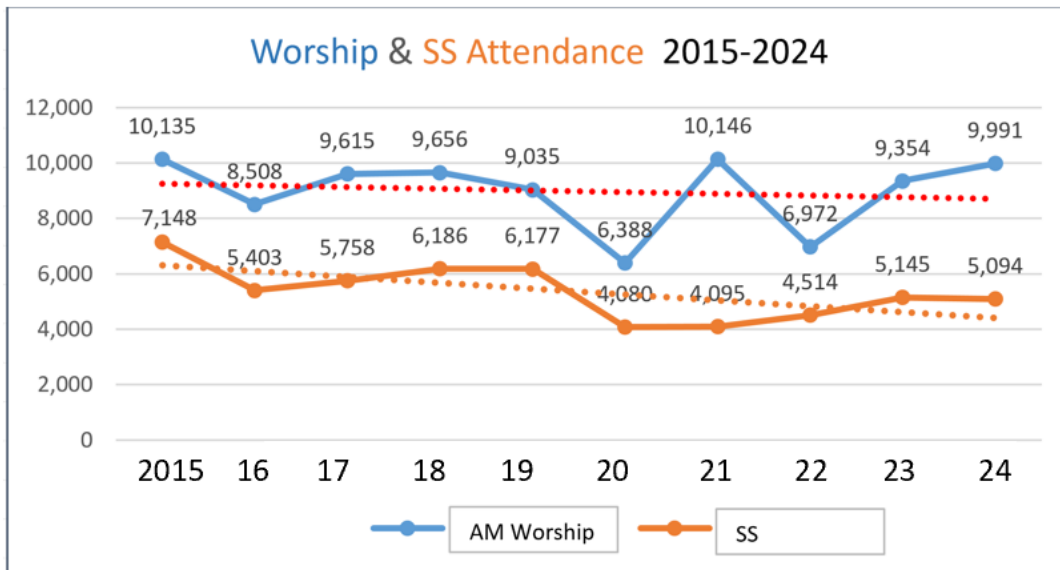

International Partnerships Consultant Report— Ray Taw

October 2024-March 2025:

I am excited at the great progress CABA and its churches have made in reaching the international community in Cincinnati and connecting these ministries globally to reach the world! Here is a general summary of what we have been doing:

1. Networking with churches, pastors, leaders, organizations, and associations to form collaborations in reaching internationals.
 - SCBO Pastors Conference
 - Asian Pastors Next Gen Conference in Richmond, VA
 - IMB conference in Kettering, OH
 - Diaspora Missions Collective Online Meetings
 - WMU conference in New Albany, OH
 - Men's conference at Urbancrest church.
 - Gracepoint Fellowship in Middle Town and Dublin Baptist Church in Dublin.
2. Launch and promote new ministries for internationals in ESL (ESL Partners Network) and in soccer (IFCC-International Football Club of Cincinnati). Collaborate with several churches interested in these ministries for internationals, e.g., Mt. Carmel Baptist Church, Lakota Hills Baptist Church, Woodside Church, H2O, Beacon Church, Liberty Heights Church, First Baptist South Lebanon, Glory Baptist Church, and International Fellowship Church (IFC).
3. Meet with various ethnic church plants to determine their needs and ascertain how CABA can assist.
 - African church plants (S. Sudan, Kenyan, Congolese, Uganda).
 - Nepali, Indian, and Hispanic
4. Assist in the development of ethnic ministries and new church plants in Cincinnati for Vietnamese, Japanese, and Chinese people groups.

Disaster Relief— Josh Wright

Southern Baptist Disaster Relief remains one of the top three agencies that respond in crisis situations, be it natural disasters or mass casualty events. We have the largest volunteer base and deploy all over the United States, its territories, and other countries around the world. CABA members are absolutely key in these efforts to reach out to people during possibly the worst time in their lives.

Remember hurricane Milton and Helene? The flooding in West Virginia, Georgia, Florida, and Kentucky? Last October, the CABA flood recovery trailer deployed twice to Florida and a chainsaw team comprised of mostly CABA members deployed to northern Georgia.

Did you know that every time a DR team is deployed they travel with a chaplain? In January, the annual new chaplain training for Ohio was led by CABA members and saw a new CABA chaplain train and a current chaplain retrain.

In March, the flood recovery trailer was deployed to West Virginia to help after heavy flooding hit the area again. It is important to note that members of CABA were also in charge of the Incident Command, which involved organizing and directing teams from Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois in the cleanup efforts.

Disaster Relief remains a vital ministry to connect directly with hurting people, but we still need more people to train as volunteers, be it in flood recovery, chainsaw, food service or shower/laundry. In 2024, Ohio had a record-breaking 74 tornadoes. Southern Baptist Disaster Relief here in Ohio has worked alongside local law enforcement and emergency services to be known as providing good work and being absolutely trustworthy. This provides us unique opportunities to reach areas the general public is not allowed to go, but you have to be trained.

We go in and help people during times of crisis and show them in a practical, hands-on way, that God loves them, sees them, and cares about them. It changes lives and you can be part of that change.

Collegiate Ministry Report— Grant Rohlfer

The ministry house owned by CABA (The Anchor) has been well used this school year! There are currently six young men who call it home, but the Anchor is more than just a place to live. It's called the Anchor because it is a place of stability that helps students stay (or become) tethered to the Lord. The basement is a prayer and worship room with instruments and a giant prayer wall that students write on to declare God's praises. This space was used for worship nights nearly every week for the past several months, and it also provided a place to practice for H2O's on campus service where we lead over 200 college students in worship each week.

Multiple gospel-centered meetings happen at the Anchor each week. Students have one on one meetings there, as well as small group discipleship times. Lots of community events are hosted at the property which create a space for students to form Christ-centered relationships. The Anchor also hosted great outreach initiatives, such as pancake nights that attracted hundreds of students in the Fall semester. These nights were instrumental in connecting students to H2O, and ultimately to the Lord.

Finally, the Anchor plays a critical indirect role in reaching students by easing the logistics of campus ministry. Many hours and dollars have been freed up for ministry that would have otherwise been tied up trying to solve logistical challenges associated with parking and storage in a very crowded area like Clifton.

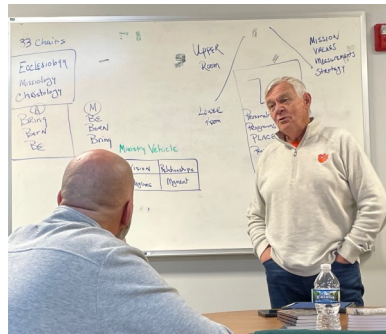
