Creating a Missions Culture

No current IMB personnel have been sent by a CABA church. A few years ago I conducted a study among newly-commissioned IMB missionaries and learned that there were several key points that God used to mobilize them for missions:

- Attended a children's missionary training program, primarily the WMU's Royal Ambassadors or Girls in Action.
- Participated in an overseas missions project. Most were returning to serve where they visited and worked.
- Took a missions class while in seminary even if they weren't getting a missions degree.
- Stayed abreast of international news, especially in times of human need.

• At least half said God had used a pastor's sermon on Isaiah 6 (Send me!) as the trigger.

CABA has taken three steps toward mobilizing international missionaries:

Grady Nutt, the late humorist and pastor, said that during a wake, the home was so full of mourners that the only place he could meet with the widow was in the hall bathroom. When they finished, he stood up and just as she opened the door, he automatically flushed the commode. Every eye in the house gave him a horrified look that matched his own!

Pastors provide a tremendous ministry during the death of a loved one. They counsel, they listen, they lead eulogies, and they are there for you.

My Dad, age 92, died in January and his funeral was on my birthday. We were very close, but he had dementia and was in decline since last Fall. He was a wonderful Christian man, so his funeral was a celebration. It was great to see my pastor James Kerr and also Bill Hounshell and Ken Dillard in the receiving line prior to the funeral. They had made the two-hour trip to Kentucky. We have received hundreds of timely cards and posts. These kinds of connections have more impact than I could have ever imagined.

The biggest surprise was the cost and logistics that my mother had to endure while grieving. My brother and our fantastic wives helped keep track of expenses. Costs included funeral, obituary, casket, vault, thank you cards, flowers, honorariums, meals, and cemetery plot with updated tombstone.

While I can't recommend grief counseling in a hall bathroom, I can give my thanks to God for Dr. Kerr and other CABA pastors who help in times of bereavement.

Mission Dignity, a Guidestone Ministry, increased their funeral benefit for a widowed pastor's spouse a couple of years ago. Mission Dignity also provides \$9 million annually in benefits to a number of widows. Applicants need to meet some requirements. Consider having a Mission Dignity Sunday in your church. She devised a plan to have short video interactions with her students, and as a means of engaging them, she let them choose her hair color. Yep, she began to dye her hair different colors weekly. Now kids know the color of the week, and they will wear clothes that match Ms. Betty's hair all because she didn't want preschool kids to be disconnected during COVID.

Ms. Betty and Ms. Jewell have collectively taught for 100 years.

Everyone isn't Billy Graham, but maybe you could be a Ms. Betty or Ms. Jewell in your church. Their stories are still being written as is yours.

Remember when Jesus called His disciples to make disciples of all nations, He left them with the promise that He will be with us always, until the end of the age (Matthew 28:18-20). He's with the missionaries. He's with the pastors, and He's with the Sunday school teachers. You may want to change the title in your church – from Sunday school teacher to lostness-eroding, world-changing, Jesus-exalting missions catalyst.

2. Provided a year's free subscription to *Missions Journey Kids Leader Guide* and *Activity Kit*. (\$68 value) All you have to do is order it from the WMU. Let us help you order by March 27.

3. Offered a free year's subscription to the new *The Baptist Paper* which comes out twice every month. It is offered as digital via email or mailed in newspaper form to your home. (\$16.75 value we are getting for \$10.) Let us help you subscribe. Deadline: March 27th. None of these methods will manipulate a person to serve as a career missionary. 

We are looking forward to our time together at the Semi-Annual Meeting on March 27. Our two ALT sub-teams on Credentialing and on Collegiate Ministries will be reporting on their work. In addition, we will be reviewing the revised language on the Trustees that will be voted upon in October.

Our churches have contributed \$78,269.33 through the first 4 months of our fiscal year, which is an 0.96% decrease for the same period last year.

CABA Trailer is off to a great start with 51 reservations made already this year. If you are planning events I encourage you to get your reservations in now before the trailers are no longer available. Easter weekend and the 4th of July are already filling up.

Last year was our busiest year in trailer rentals so we are expanding our number of trailers. We have added one trailer and plan to add one more by next year. Our newest Block Party Trailer will be ready this Spring. Trailer #3 will be kept at First Baptist Church South Lebanon, 505 West Mason Road, South Lebanon, Ohio 45065. This trailer will include one Standard Bounce House, a Blackstone Griddle, a Portable Sound System, three food machines: snow cone, popcorn and cotton candy, 2 10'x10' awnings, 2 6' Folding Tables, 1 Corn-hole Set and 1 generator. We do not provide food or paper products on the trailer and you will need to provide your own propane tank and utensils to cook. This trailer is a 14ft. trailer and requires at least a 3/4 ton pickup truck to pull it. Use only a 2 5/16 in. ball to tow. The CABA Church user fee is \$140 and for non-CABA Churches, the fee is \$200.00.



This past year I have been helping with English as a Second Language (ESL) at Lakota Hills Baptist Church.

ESL has become a major way to reach the nations at Lakota Hills. Students from over twenty different nations attend the ESL classes at Lakota. Over the past several years Lakota has helped plant churches to reach the Korean, Nepali, Arabic, and Spanish speaking populations. Several other people groups have been identified as possible church planting opportunities.

This year all the Spanish speakers have been grouped into three classes or levels. After the class students are gathered into one room to hear a short message from Pastor Bob Allen in Spanish. Bob is planting a Spanish speaking church at Lakota Hills. On a normal evening thirty to forty students will attend the Spanish speaking classes. Pray for Pastor Bob and his wife Kari as they plant a church to reach the Spanish speakers in the West Chester Area.

When I talk with Jose, he tells me how he hopes to meet more college students his age while visiting. I immediately thought of one of our Collegiate church planters, Grant Rohlfer, who is planting a church to reach UC students as well as the community in the Clifton area.

Grant invited Jose to a bible study at UC where he can meet other college students and learn more about Jesus. My prayer is that Jose will go back to Peru as a missionary telling others about Jesus.

Pray for the Lord of the Harvest to keep calling Pastors and Church Planters to reach all people groups. Your prayers for church planters are an enormous help! If your church's Sunday school classes or small groups could each adopt a church planter to pray for, that would be a major help to them. There was a small group of folks from our campus H2O that came in Monday evening. There was also a few from another Christian group at UC called Campus Outreach. Late in the evening the entire group of worshipers lifted up their brothers/sisters







For the rest of the week these groups made special effort to go out on campus to share the Gospel with as many as would listen and saw the Holy Spirit convict and draw students in a special way.

I remember the impact of a similar experience that happened on the campus at Asbury in 1970. It was considered by many as the impetus of the Jesus Movement of that decade. It was the last great revival experience in North America until a couple of weeks ago. I have had many conversations with students and older adults about what was occurring and how it was spreading. Please pray for God's continued movement through our college students. Pray for the impact of the past 12 days to spread to other campuses and churches. This has already begun to happen. Pray that students would be protected from those who might try to coop this movement into something else. Pray that students would be bold in sharing their faith and making much of Jesus in the coming days, weeks, months, and beyond. Pray for our campuses. Thanks for your faithfulness.
